The Ellinis docked in Melbourne on the 30th of December, 1965 where we were met by the Presbyterian Chaplin of Victoria, the Reverent Crighton-Barr, plus parishioners from the community at St Giles - who were absolutely amazingly generous. We were "billeted" with a local family in Moonya Road, Carnegie. They were a fantastic couple who totally took such great care of all of us for the 10 days until the "duplex" at 350 Neerim Road, which the St. Giles community had organised became available. Mum and us kids then moved into our new Aussie home. Incredibly, the parishioners supplied us with everything a family of 5 would need to set up home, as all our belongings and furniture were in a very large container which would take 3 months to arrive in Melbourne.

The day our "container" arrived was momentous!

It took support from the St. Giles community to gradually return all our borrowed household furniture and items to their rightful owners. Then on "THE DAY" set up our new home with all our wonderful, familiar furniture, beds, couch and lounge chairs, bedding etc - we even carpets!



At the end of the day, we thanked everyone for all their generous time and support over the past 3 months, we shut the front door, and very excitedly, settled into our now familiar family setting, where we just sat around and smiled a lot at each other, total satisfied that we were now "REAL DINKUM AUSSIES".

COVID UPDATE

Covid 19 is like all viruses. It changes and evolves over time. Vaccinations, whether its for Covid or Flu etc., do not mean that you won't get Covid or Flu. All it means is that it reduces the risk of serious illness or death from the virus if you should come in contact with it. I would like a dollar for every time I've heard 'Vaccinations don't work. I've had my Flu vaccination and still got Flu.' If you hadn't had the vaccination, you might well have ended up in hospital seriously ill. It's the same with the Covid Vaccines.

There are new evolved strains of Covid in the community. If you have kept up with your vaccinations (currently I have had 5), then these vaccines will continue to provide strong protection against **serious** disease. The government as part of its community protection program, has approved a 6th booster shot. Moderna monovalent also known as COVID-19 x BB1.5 Vaccine, has been approved and has being rolled out from the 11th December 2023. This new vaccine has been found to provide modest improvement on the older vaccines, against the different strains circulating at the moment.

Older citizens and people who are Immuno-compromised are at a higher risk of developing a serious reaction if they catch Covid and are urged to consider getting the 6th booster shot. This information was taken from

The Committee of Management was thrilled to bestow Life Membership on Neville Curtis for his dedicated committment and service to U3A Bentleigh for 18 years.

Providing computer education, support and technical know-how, keeping members connected

Since 2021, The Hub (Room 63) has been focused on supporting members.

In our recent annual survey, we asked for your feedback regarding what you personally need or would like to see provided in The Hub by way of computers and technology generally. The 2023 survey responses covered a very diverse range of subjects. There was a small trend at one end towards very basic computer learning, and at the other end, a focus on more advanced topics such as AI, Chat, cyber-safety, etc. An interesting one was for a footy-tipping competition which, we're happy to report, we are looking to develop for 2024 footy season!

Our current small group of IT volunteers (Michael Bonacci, Val English, Eric Aston, Dr Ulrich Seydel and Nick Ancora), will be meeting to discuss the results of the survey, and how they can best meet the very diverse needs you have asked for. What comes out of the discussion will be posted on the website and in Messenger.

In the meantime, here is what is already in place for 2024, including the following Summer School programme:

Understanding Your Computer Part 1 & Part 2 (Tutor - Eric Aston): Wed 17 & 24 Jan, 10am - 12noon

REGULAR COURSES FOR 2024

Mondays 10 – 11am: Introduction to Power Point (Tutor - Dr Ulrich Seydel) - a short 4-week course which will be repeated 4 times, aimed at providing valuable skills for presentations, and even for formatting an electronic Xmas letter. The course is ideal for both tutors and member participants.
