### **COVID UPDATE**



Highlights for me were the Vegetable Bharji and the scones with jam and cream.



For the people who don't know me, my name is Constantine (Costas) Pothoulakis, and I am tutoring the Painting session of Tuesday and the drawing of Wednesday mornings.

I have been a full time illustrator trading as Creart Graphics P/L between 1975 and 2015, concentrating in the commercial side of art, accepting commissions of any type and size. Some say that an artist never retires. This is only partly correct because an artist could stop accepting commission work, yes, but the artist side of him can never be far from his easel and brushes.

Early last year, powers in my household which I could not resist convinced me to look into joining U3A in order to teach people how to draw, and paint. So, here I am, transferring knowledge, principles and techniques of art making. I find that grown ups find it a little difficult to adopt ways which are new to them, but I have to say that they actually do try with seriousness and diligence. This makes me enormously happy, and I find it rewarding, because everyone without exception do see clearly where I am taking them art wise, assisted by the daily demos, so they see first hand how each lesson is being executed.

They said, "I'm afraid it looks like she's been hit by a bus." I said, "I know, but she has a lovely personality."



## RECIPES FOR ONE

**Open-Face Goat** Cheese Sandwich with Tomato & Avocado Salad



#### Ingredients

34 cup grape tomatoes, halved 1/3 avocado, peeled and cubed (or sliced) 1/8 teaspoon salt 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil plus 2 Tbsp., divided 34 ounce soft goat cheese (2 Tbsp.) Penny For Pound, award-winning pies of your paragraph text large slice whole-wheat bread (11/2 oz.), toasted 1/8 teaspoon ground pepper

1 tablespoon pine nuts, toasted (see Tip) 1 1/2 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar

#### **Directions**


Combine tomatoes, avocado, salt, and 1/4 cup basil in a small bowl.

Spread goat cheese over toast. Sprinkle with pepper and the remaining 2 Tbsp. basil.

Serve the tomato salad alongside the toast. Sprinkle everything with pine nuts and drizzle with oil. Serve vinegar on the side.

#### Tips

To toast pine nuts, cook in a small dry skillet over medium-low heat, stirring constantly, until fragrant, 2 to 4 minutes. Transfer to a small plate and let cool.
